


Status of Standardization Process in China

• In sharp contrast to European and international technical standardisation, which is privately driven, China's approach is state-centric, a legacy of the PRC's past as a planned economy.




China's Growing Footprint in International Technical Standardization

De facto Standardization along the BRI: implicit internationalization of Chinese standards

- By Sept. 2019, China had signed 90 bilateral agreements on technical standardization cooperation with 52 countries and regions.
- China has also concluded 16 MoU's with BRI countries regarding digital standard setting as part of the Digital Silk Road.
 - Many China's BRI Projects include an explicit standardisation dimension.
- For instance, in Turkmenistan the South Yolotan gas field development with China National Petroleum Corporation included 83 Chinese standards related to the Energy business.
